Examen

Presence: Become aware of God's presence. Spend a moment in silence in the company of the Holy Spirit asking God to bring clarity to your day.

Gratitude: Recall one or two things that happened today for which you can be grateful. What gifts did you receive today? What gifts did you give? Thank God for these gifts.

Review: Review your day from beginning to end and notice where you felt God's presence. Pay attention to your emotions. When did you love? When were you loved? When were you known? When did you know others?

Pray: Choose one experience of the day and pray about it. Ask God to lead your prayer to something specific about today. Maybe it's a significant encounter or a feeling you experienced. Whether the prayer be repentance, gratitude, praise, or intercession, spend a moment praying.

Expect: Look toward tomorrow. Ask God to grant you the wisdom, courage, and grace you will need to meet tomorrow's challenges. Again, pay attention to your feelings about tomorrow. Are you anxious? Stressed? Cheerful?

Encouraging one another to follow Jesus
